 - V11. Rahab believes that the Lord is the God of both heaven and earth. Her confession of faith.
 - V12-13. Rahab request the salvation of her household.
 - V15. Rahab's faith moves her to action.
 - V18. Rahab is required to hang a scarlet thread outside her window. What is the scarlet thread of redemption?
 - V19-20. What 3 things did Rahab do for her home to be saved?
 - V21. Rahab placed the scarlet cord outside her window.
 - V24. God gave Israel victory.
