The Covenant Is Renewed. (1-9)

- V1. Israel's two enemies were the Amorites & the Canaanites, but these nations had heard how God was fighting for His people. Both of these nations had no more courage to fight against Israel.
- V2. Instead of immediately conquering the new land, God instructed Joshua to circumcise the men of Israel for the 2nd time. (The first time took place in Gen. 17:9-14) Circumcision represented Israel's covenant with the Lord.
